As the holiday season dawns, I find myself brimming with gratitude. I want to express my profound appreciation for this incredible team, working diligently each day to ensure our Veterans have the best chance at leading peaceful lives. I'm thankful for our residents, trusting us to quide them on their journey. Finally, I am deeply grateful for your unwavering support, allowing us to serve those who've served our Nation.

Over the past year, our available housing options have continued to expand, driven by the ongoing construction of Lightfighter Village and our efforts to fund and install six ADA-compliant Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) on VTC property. Thanks to our strong community, we already have secured the funds needed to acquire the first of these ADUs. Follow the progress of these innovative projects on Facebook, Instagram, and LinkedIn, where we go by the handle @VTCofCalifornia.

In September, our work at the Veterans Hub in CTF Soledad received recognition at the Nonprofit Alliance of Monterey County Annual Nonprofit Awards ceremony, and we were honored with the Innovator award. From Millati Islami to Wiley's Wish Dog Training program, everything our Transformative Reentry team does inside CTF, directed by Jennie Nestler, provides our Veterans with a sense of self-worth, purpose, and hope for the future. This has played a pivotal role in our Veterans maintaining a 0% recidivism rate upon release into our programs.

I'm incredibly proud of our team and eagerly anticipate the possibilities that 2024 holds.

### LIGHTFIGHTER VILLAGE UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who participated in our Lightfighter Village Wall Raising Ceremony on Nov 3rd! We were honored to be surrounded by so many enthusiastic supporters and community leaders. Occasions to celebrate milestones of affordable housing projects are rare, and we are deeply grateful for the speed at which this project is progressing.

Remarks were given by Mayor of Marina Bruce Delgado, EAH's VP of Real Estate Development & Construction Dave Egan, US Representative Jimmy Panetta's Director of District Operations Erin Davison, California State Assemblymember Dawn Addis, Monterey County Supervisor Wendy Root Askew, our very own CEO Kurt Schake, and VTC founder and Board Chair Dr. Tom Griffin.

Guests signed a large beam that will be included in the construction of Lightfighter Village - a demonstration of how essential advocates like you are to VTC's ability to permanently house Veterans.



One highlight of the event was a discussion of the numerous units that will be fully ADA-accessible, with all remaining units designed to be easily adaptable to accommodate additional residents who use mobility aids. We also focused on the importance of helping Veterans find a permanent home, as Supervisor Askew emphasized the challenges of military families spending only a brief period in one place before relocating.

The estimated completion date is December 2024, with 70 Veterans and their families set to move into these new permanent supportive housing units in early 2025.





Huff Construction has made remarkable strides as they've completed underground construction, poured concrete, and raised walls. Residents and staff alike can see the progress unfolding rapidly, to our great enjoyment.

EAH Housing is a major driving force in making Lightfighter Village a reality. Without their efforts, this impactful project would not be possible. EAH will take on the administrative role to run this community, allowing VTC to dedicate our resources towards wraparound services for our Veterans. We extend our sincerest gratitude to them.

<u>Wiley's Wish</u> Animal Rescue retrieves dogs from highkill shelters on the Central Coast. Canines then are spayed/neutered, vaccinated, and microchipped while as they await their FURever homes.

VTC is thrilled to partner with this stellar non-profit to provide enrichment for Veterans at CTF Soledad. Dogs given a second chance at life are paired up with the Veterans incarcerated at CTF Soledad. Over a period of six months, they learn commands, work on positive interactions, and complete the AKC Canine Good Citizens course. If a dog displays aptitude for service dog work, they are placed in a training program and placed with a Veteran or first responder who cannot afford one.
