LETTER FROM THE CEO September 2023

Dear VTC Supporters:

As you know, our Veterans face significant barriers to reintegrate into civilian life - physical and mental trauma, isolation, and so much more. At the Veterans Transition Center of California, we are dedicated to providing wraparound services to Veterans and their families, including housing, food, clothing, case management, mental health resources, benefits assistance, substance abuse counseling, and employment support.

Our team has been working hard as we expand our programming and prepare for some exciting new projects:

We are very proud of the construction of **Lightfighter Village**. This 71-unit complex will provide permanent supportive housing for low-income Veterans and their families, and, once complete, the number of Veterans we serve will nearly double in size. Partnering with EAH Housing and Huff Construction, we are planning an official groundbreaking ceremony this autumn - keep an eye out for updates as details are finalized!

I'd like to highlight our<u>Long-Term Offender Reentry Recovery</u> <u>Program (LTORR)</u> - we now partner with correctional facilities across the state to assist Veterans being released from prison. This smooth transition into VTC housing and connection with our programming makes it easier for Veterans to find stability, build healthy habits, and become productive members of society. LTORR serves as a model for successful reentry, with a <u>0% recidivism</u> rate for Veterans in our programs.

With the support of the State of California, we have built the nation's first **Veterans Hub at CTF Soledad**. This Veterandedicated yard allows us to provide group therapy and other enrichment opportunities that link up with the services we provide on the outside once they are released.

This work is all made possible by contributions from generous supporters like you. We hope you will take a moment to donate to this worthy cause! Thank you for all you have done to ensure our heroes are not left behind nor forgotten. Sincerely,

I am a 42-year-old Veteran. I served four years in the Army, including one tour in Iraq. Since that time, I've discovered that riding a bicycle is an activity that promotes quality of health and peace of mind. Indeed while I was living in Arizona, I believed that cycling kept me sane. However, upon moving to Marina, I realized that my single gear road bike on the sandy and inclined trails was now much more arduous and dangerous.

Then the VTC and BESV changed my life. I was referred to a job working with Joby Aviation and gifted a remarkable bike that would restore my enjoyment and quality of life. I was blown away by the fact that not only was this a sleek and extremely sturdy electric bicycle, but it was actually big enough for me. You see I am 6'6" so it's not always easy to fit into cars, clothina, or onto bicycles. After using the simple articulation in the handlebars and seat, I was comfortable enough to ride as long as the battery would last. And last it did! With a full charge I can make the round trip of 7.2 miles round trip to and from work every day, with even more energy to spare.

I just want to say how much I love my BESV E-Bike. I'm able to ride fast with the confidence that the solid construction, electric speed, beefy tires and well illuminated lights, will help keep me safe as I work towards a better future.

LIGHTFIGHTER VILLAGE UPDATE

We are another step closer to the construction of Lightfighter Village (LFV). <u>Huff Construction</u> has been hard at work preparing the site of this affordable housing community for our Veterans. Derelict buildings have been demolished, old pavement has been torn out, and the site is leveled.

This three-story, 71-unit housing structure will rest on 2.3 acres and consist of 64 studio apartments and seven two-bedroom family apartments reserved for low-income Veterans and their families. Residents at LVF will have access to support services here at VTC, a community room and courtyard, computer lab, pet wash station, meditation room, fitness center, laundry facility, community garden, play structure, and solar carports.

We want to thank <u>EAH housing</u> for teaming up with us to turn this dream into a reality so Veterans and their families can live with the dignity and security they have earned.



PROGRAM OF THE QUARTER

There are nearly 7,000 Veterans incarcerated in California, and reintegration into society rarely is easy for them. That is why we have teamed up with CTF Soledad to build the nation's first dedicated yard for Veterans, providing them with tools they need for successful reentry. Upon their release, our **Long-Term Reentry Recovery Program** assists Veterans with finding housing, obtaining a job, participating in group counseling, and many other services. The strength of this program is clear - our participants have maintained a 0% recidivism rate. No Veteran has reoffended under our care, compared with the State average rate of 46%. The numbers speak for themselves.
